If you're like most of us, only a little. Thankfully, we have grown accustomed to obtaining safe reliable drinking water from our faucets day after day, without having to give it a second thought.

Seal Rock Water District is making changes to keep that true.

Following years of discussions with stakeholders and neighboring property owners, and after months of construction, the District is pleased to announce that the new membrane water treatment facility is now in operation. Beginning in early April District engineers along with contractors began the process of withdrawing raw water from Beaver Creek and pumping the water to a secure site located above the Makai community, where it is being treated using a modern membrane filtration technology. With support and approval from the State of Oregon Health Authority, flow from the plant began to be blended with flow in the distribution system as functional testing of various portions of the system was certified by the engineer.
